### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Heinz Edelman was born in Usti nad Labem, Czechoslovakia in 1934 and moved to Germany in 1946. He attended the Academy of Fine Arts in Dusseldorf, a prestigious art school that counted Joseph Beuys among its faculty, but where graphic design was not really being studied. After receiving a degree in Art Education, he began working as a copywriter at an advertising agency. In 1959 he accepted his first graphic design commissions, and by the mid-1960s was teaching the subject. He gained widespread attention for his work as art director on the 1968 film *Yellow Submarine*, which built on a style he had developed in parallel with Milton Glaser throughout the 1960s. Despite the popularity of the film, in the years following he developed toward a more rough-edged aesthetic, making use of blown-up illustrations that emphasize irregularity in line, and replacing the soft psychedelic characters of the sixties with stranger anthropomorphic creatures rendered in a darker palette. He was acclaimed in Germany through the 1980s and 1990s for posters he designed for the Westdeutscher Rundfunk broadcasting station and the avant-garde publisher Klett-Cotta, for whom he demonstrated a growing interest in the combination of writing, design and illustration in book format. Throughout this period he continued teaching, principally at the Stuttgart Academy of Fine Arts. His work in design and illustrations for the periodicals *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung* and *Twen*, has been awarded many prizes internationally and exhibited in solo exhibitions in Europe, the United States and Japan. In 2005, he was the subject of a Masters Series show at the School of Visual Arts. He divides his time between Stuttgart and Amsterdam.

**SCOPE AND CONTENT**

All the items in this collection are referenced to the original item numbers indicated by Heinz Edelman in his pro forma invoice of the contents of his donation, except items 127, 132 and 137, which were numbered but omitted from the invoice, and 133b and 134b, which were neither numbered nor invoiced. In addition to the numbering system, the invoice contains notes and background on many of the works included. Photocopies of the invoice are available.
